
Gully Erosion Repairs Program Terms & Conditions

Objective:

- To minimize water erosion and flooding damage by providing physical adjustments and alterations along gully formations.

Eligibility:

- Land must be located in the La Salle Redboine Conservation District.
- A natural or artificial watercourse must display evidence of severe water erosion and sediment transport.



Roles and Responsibilities:

The Applicant Shall:

- Request assistance by application, which is to be received by the Conservation District office;
- Provide consent of entry for construction and inspection, if necessary;
- Provide sufficient room for construction according to improved condition of watercourse;
- Purchase appropriate seed for revegetation;
- Allow District to place signage at project site for CD contribution to project; signage removal must be approved by the Conservation District prior to removal; and
- Indemnify and save harmless the District from any and all actions, claims, suits, damages, injuries, or other loss no matter howsoever arising as a result of the construction, operation or maintenance of the project.

The CD Shall:

- Provide on-site inspection with landowner prior to construction;
- Complete construction as specified on application form up to maximum specified; and
- Inspect annually after spring run-off.

PROJECTS WILL BE PRIORITISED EACH YEAR AS FOLLOWS:

1. Residential yard sites and public property.
2. By land classification (i.e. higher classified land receives higher priority.)
3. Depending on current fiscal year commitments, municipal granting for cost-sharing will be considered in the prioritisation process.

Project Funding/Cost-Sharing/Incentives:

- Funding for the gully stabilization will be 80% Conservation District up to a maximum \$3,000 per project. The Landowner will be responsible for the remaining 20% and all costs over the CD maximum.
